Project Title	ITALIAN LANGUAGE – LEVEL B1
Training Objectives	<p>The course aims to develop basic communicative competence in the Italian language, corresponding to the B1 level of the CEFR, enabling participants to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Consolidate B1-level language skills according to the QCER.• Develop autonomy in oral and written comprehension and production.• Prepare specifically for passing the B1 certification exam at CPIA.• Strengthen the use of Italian in study, work, and everyday life contexts.
Course Content	<p>Listening Comprehension</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Listening to authentic texts (dialogues, interviews, formal communications).• Understanding instructions, opinions, and main and detailed information. <p>Speaking and Interaction</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Conversations on current topics, work, and everyday life.• Expressing opinions, agreeing/disagreeing, and simple argumentation.• Simulations of CPIA oral exams. <p>Reading Comprehension</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Reading informative, narrative, and regulatory texts.• Analysis of texts similar to those found in the CPIA exam. <p>Writing Production</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Writing coherent texts (emails, letters, short argumentative texts).• Guided exercises on written exam tasks. <p>Grammar and Vocabulary</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Review and consolidation of B1 structures (verb tenses, basic conditional sentences, pronouns, connectors).• Expansion of thematic and functional vocabulary. <p>CPIA Exam Preparation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Structure of the B1 exam.• Exam simulation and test-taking strategies.• Intermediate assessments and individual feedback.
Minimum Entry Requirements	<p>FORMAL REQUIREMENTS: Completion of compulsory education and the right-duty to education and training, regardless of employment status, and residence or domicile in the Emilia-Romagna region prior to enrollment in the course.</p> <p>SUBSTANTIVE REQUIREMENTS: Knowledge of the Italian language at an A2 level of the QCER, verified through a structured entry test.</p>
Participation Procedures	<p>Applications will be considered in chronological order, with the course starting based on actual demand and upon reaching a minimum of 8 participants (who have applied and meet the required criteria).</p>
Professional Profile	<p>The course provides skills to communicate in Italian, both orally and in writing, at the B1 level of the QCER. At the end of the training, each participant will be guaranteed access to the exam at a certification body recognized by the competent ministries, to obtain a certificate attesting knowledge of the Italian language at B1 level, valid under current legislation.</p>
Certificate Awarded	<p>Certificate of attendance.</p>

Upon specific request from one or more participants, in-person attendance at the designated training locations will be guaranteed.
